Featuring the artists DaNice Marshall, Matt Brackett, and Arnaya Needleman, this show weaves together elements of history, contemporary issues, and technological advancements to provide a nuanced exploration of the creative process. By delving into these subjects, the exhibition offers viewers a window into the ways in which art can serve as a powerful lens for examining our shared human experiences. Viewers are encouraged to contemplate the ways in which creativity can inspire meaningful dialogue.

The exhibition is curated by Ashleigh Dior Coren. Coren is a content strategist, educator, and curator based in the Washington, D.C. area. A Dorchester native, Ashleigh has worked for the Smithsonian, the University of Maryland, College Park, and the Institute of Contemporary Art, Boston.

In addition, the Quincy Art Association’s Member of the Month Showcase features masterful oils by Quincy resident Kris Kreitman.
